



Daily routine

- On the first day back, both Year 3 teachers will be on the playground to welcome the children and show them to the Year 3 entrance and cloakrooms.
- After the first day, the children will enter via the Y3/4 entrance independently, the doors are open from 8.40am.
- The children will come into the cloakroom and put their belongings on their pegs, except for their reading record and water bottle, which they will need to bring with them to the classroom.
- They will need to put their reading record in the 'changing box' outside the classroom if they have finished their book. There is also a box for their water bottle, and they will need to give in any homework.



End of the day

- School finishes at 3.15pm
- · Children will be brought out by an adult.
- <u>All</u> children are expected to tell this adult who they are going home with.
- Please inform us if there are any changes to the usual pick up arrangements with a note or phone call to the office. Please do not just use the class email to inform us, as we don't always get the chance to check it until the children have gone home.
- If the children are late being collected, they will be taken to the office.

Reading

- We have a comprehensive reading scheme which runs throughout KS2. All children will be given a book from the scheme to bring home.
- The expectation is that every child in Y3 must read their school reading book aloud <u>at least 3 times</u> per week, to an adult. Any other reading is a bonus but can still be written into the children's planner.
 - Each week, we will celebrate the Star Readers (those children who have read their school reading book at least 3 times in a week). This is similar to the Rocket Readers in Y2.
 - The emphasis is on comprehension of the text and not how many books they are able to read.

<u>Homework</u>

- The children will have alternate maths/ reading comprehension /grammar homework which will be given out on Wednesdays and collected by the following Wednesday.
- Children will continue to bring home their spellings on a look/cover/write sheet for a test each week. On the other side, there will be an activity for them to complete that is linked to the rule.
- Times tables are tested on a weekly basis by the end of Year 3, children should know their 2,3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables.
 - Times table Rockstars should be used regularly.
